Return your sheet to Chappelow's Newsagents to claim your reward.

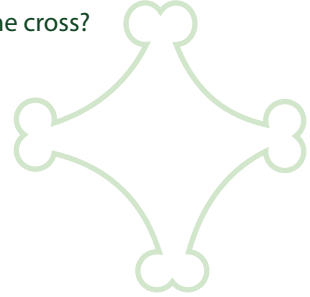
CLUE

Which shop is in the narrowest building?

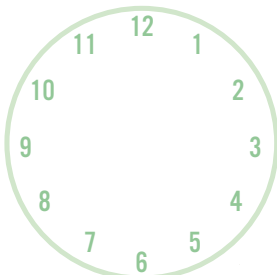
CLUE
